Northern Health Connections

SUMMARY

Northern Health Connections is a health transportation service that was established in 2006. The routes and times have been designed to enable access to health services and medical appointments. This is a flexible service allowing for the routes and times to be shifted and redesigned as services are changed, added, and as physician/nurse practitioner referral patterns change.

The Northern Health Connections Service is heading into its 13th year in operation. Northern Health Connections continues to transport non-urgent health care passengers to their medical appointments, as well as provide seniors (60+) with low-cost transportation to various locations along our existing routes. 2019 sees increase in ridership

The Connections ridership continues to grow each year. This fiscal year Connections transported 16,968 passengers. This number is up from the previous year's total of 13,073 passengers - representing a 30% increase year over year. The overall ridership is up.

Rider eligibility criteria expanded

To be eligible for the NH Connections program, patients must have a valid BC Services Card, not require care from a health professional (physician or nurse) during their trip and need to access a health service that is not available in their home community (such as cancer treatment, hemodialysis, specialist physician etc.) Appointments are verified. Other eligible patients are those who have been transported outside of their home community by BC Emergency Health Services (ambulance or medevac) and need return travel home.

Health Care Staff and Students (locums, nurses, physicians etc. can also access the service).

In July 2018, Northern Health Connections broadened the eligibility criteria to allow individuals 60 years and older to travel without having to attend a medical appointment. Of the total 16,968 passengers this year, 2,466 of those passengers belonged to this new "60+" category.

By refreshing the fleet on an annual basis, a safe and reliable service can be maintained with minimized down time, while providing a pleasant and comfortable travel experience for all passengers. 






Testimonial from a senior utilizing the 60+ category
